Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom

Resurrectional Troparion, Tone 7

By Thy <u>Cross</u> Thou didst destroy <u>death</u>. To the thief Thou didst open <u>Paradise</u>. For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers Thou didst change weeping into <u>joy</u>, and Thou didst command Thy disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that Thou art <u>risen</u>,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mercy</u>.

Troparion, Tone 1 (St. Mark)

O <u>bless</u>ed Mark, O voice of God. As an apostle of Christ you were taught by the chief apostle <u>Peter</u> – like the <u>sun</u> you brought light to the <u>nations</u>, enrichment of Alex<u>andria</u>. Liber<u>a</u>tor of Egypt from pagan de<u>lusions</u>, as a pillar of light to the church you enlightened all by your evangelical <u>teachings</u>. <u>There</u>fore we honor your memory with great fest<u>ivity</u>, pray to God the giver of the gospel that He will grant the for<u>giveness</u> of sins.

Troparion, Tone 2 (Prophet Obadiah)

We <u>cel</u>ebrate the <u>memory</u> of Your Prophet Oba<u>di</u>ah, O Lord; through <u>him</u> we be<u>seech</u> You: "<u>Save</u> our souls!"

Troparion, Tone 4 (Martyr Barlaam)

Armed with youthful <u>fer</u>vor, you endured martyrdom in old age and <u>glo</u>rified Christ. You offered Him your right hand as a whole burnt <u>offering</u> and your holy soul as a blameless <u>sac</u>rifice.// Intercede that all may be granted forgiveness, Great-martyr <u>Bar</u>laam!

Resurrectional Kontakion, Tone 7

The dominion of death can no longer hold men <u>cap</u>tive, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its <u>powers</u>. Hell is <u>bound</u>, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: "The Savior has come to <u>those</u> in faith;// enter, you faithful, into the Resurrection!"

Kontakion, Tone 2 (St. Mark)

You re<u>ceived</u> the grace of the Spirit from above most <u>glor</u>ious Mark! And destroyed rhetorical snares, O A<u>pos</u>tle. You <u>cap</u>tured all nations bringing them to your <u>Mas</u>ter by the <u>preaching</u> of the Divine <u>Gos</u>pel.

Kontakion, Tone 1 (Prophet Obadiah)

The great Oba<u>di</u>ah, acquiring a mind luminous with divine <u>splen</u>dor, speaks through the Holy Spirit, proclaiming <u>things</u> to come. To<u>day</u> we honor him with <u>faithful</u> minds, //celebrating his holy memory which enlightens the <u>hearts</u> of men.

Kontakion, Tone 3 (Martyr Barlaam)

Though weak with old <u>age</u> you vanquished the <u>Evil</u> One in your mighty contest, O <u>Bar</u>laam. You en<u>dured</u> the rack like one without a <u>body</u>, and steadfastly endured the <u>burning</u> of your hand. Therefore, God the Word has <u>crowned</u> you with a <u>crown</u> of <u>glory</u>.

Kontakion, Tone 6 (Theotokos)

Steadfast Protectress of <u>Christians</u>, Constant Advocate before the Creator; despise not the entreating cries of us <u>sin</u>ners, but in your goodness come speedily to help us who <u>call</u> on you in <u>faith</u>. Hasten to hear our petition and to intercede for us, O Theo<u>to</u>kos, for you always protect those who <u>hon</u>or you.


Communion Hymns

Praise the Lord from the heavens! Praise Him in the highest! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Among the saints we commemorate today: The Holy Prophet Obadiah [or Abdia] is the fourth of the Twelve Minor Prophets, and he lived during the ninth century B.C. He was from the village of Betharam, near Sichem, and he served as steward of the impious Israelite King Ahab. In those days the whole of Israel had turned away from the true God and had begun to offer sacrifice to Baal, but Obadiah faithfully served the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in secret.

When Ahab's wife, the impious and dissolute Jezebel, hunted down all the prophets of the Lord (because of her quarrel with the Prophet Elias), Obadiah gave them shelter and food (3/1 Kgs 18:3 ff). Ahab's successor King Okhoziah [Ahaziah] sent three detachments of soldiers to arrest the holy Prophet Elias (July 20). One of these detachments was headed by Saint Obadiah. Through the prayer of Saint Elias, two of the detachments were consumed by heavenly fire, but Saint Obadiah and his detachment were spared by the Lord 4/2 Kgs 1).

From that moment Saint Obadiah resigned from military service and became a follower of the Prophet Elias. Afterwards, he himself received the gift of prophecy. The God-inspired work of Saint Obadiah is the fourth of the Books of the Twelve Minor Prophets in the Bible, and contains predictions about the New Testament Church. The holy Prophet Obadiah was buried in Samaria.



The Holy Martyr Barlaam lived in Antioch of Syria. During Diocletian's persecution against Christians, the aged Saint Barlaam

was arrested and brought to trial, where he confessed himself a Christian.

The judge, wanting to compel the saint to renounce Christ, ordered that Saint Barlaam be brought to the pagan altar. His right hand was placed over it, and a red-hot censer burning with incense was put into his hand. The torturer thought that a physically weak old man could not endure the pain and would drop it on the altar. In this way he would involuntarily be offering sacrifice to the idol. However, the saint held on to the censer until his hand fell off. After this, the holy Martyr Barlaam surrendered his soul to the Lord.
