### Sin - Part II

In the last issue, I wrote about a different view of sin. As I write this article, we've just completed our Archdiocesan Clergy Continuing Education Program which was hosted here at St. Mark. This years topic addressed clinical and pastoral issues related to substance abuse. The sessions covered, among other things, the national crisis involving fatal opioid abuse which has received so much media coverage of late. Addictions of all kinds were discussed

and the latest available statistics were presented across the board. The numbers were staggering in terms of how many people's lives are either directly or indirectly affected by addiction.

When we add behavioral addictions and compulsions which may be distinct from substance abuse, but are often conditioned by the same disfunctional circumstances and context of human life, we realize that ALL of us are touched by it. In a word, we are once again, talking about "sin" and its far reaching effects.

Whether it's oversleeping, smoking, shopping, hoarding, overeating, drinking, rage, lying, sex, drugs, gaming or internet enticements, we humans often become enslaved to counter productive and self destructive behavior. We take comfort and refuge in pleasure and fantasy to escape the pain and difficulties of reality. Abuse, shame, self loathing, fear, violence, treachery, dishonesty, and neglect are some, but not even close to all of the many

things that can hurt us and close our hearts to the love of God and those around us.

As the presentation went on, I saw that addiction is the very epitome of how the power of temptaion and sin are at work in our lives. St. Paul talks about being "enslaved" to sin. This IS addiction from a spiritual perspective. It is also likened to a sickness as our hymnography refers to Judas "ailing with avarice". Breaking the chains of sin in the form of our varied obses-

sions, compulsions and addictions is very difficult, but not impossible. In many instances, clinical help and treatment is required. Interventions, diagnosis, detoxification, therapy and counseling

may be necessary. But finally, there must be a change of heart and the embrace of truth. We must humbly call out to a "higher power" knowing that we are powerless. A renowned feature of addiction is denial. Fr. Thomas Hopko once said that "you are only as sick as your secrets." It's crucial for us to realize that the power of sin is many times enshrined in secrecy. The Church in her wisdom offers us the blessing of confession. Often, when we recognize and admit our sins and confess them openly, the chains are broken and we are given self control. The truth is known and reality is faced squarely.

Christ, our Heavenly Physician, comes to seek and to save the lost. He is the truth and He comes to set us free.

In the Bible I used during my Seminary classes, when dinosaurs roamed the earth, in the margin next to this verse I wrote, "intimacy and confidence that we shall be heard." Not an original thought, I'm certain, but relationship with God is both complicated and simple, and sometimes remembering that in fact we are in a relationship with God, is still difficult for me.



Recently a friend related that after a move across the country and the building of a new home she had prayed that God would help her find a job. She had already joined a parish in the area, but was surprised when the parish priest called her within a few days. He asked her to teach church school. She did, but she also revised her job prayer to include a salary.

God is like that.

Another friend told me that after asking God to make her more useful to others she was soon diagnosed with cancer. That seems incongruous, but during her battle she was VERY useful to others. As a therapist, she had spent countless hours helping others with their concerns, problems and relationships. But her life during illness was a picture of faith and faithfulness, accompanied by humor and sensitivity. The lessons are unforgettable and imminently useful.



One day I had a call from someone who needed help. Sick at home, she needed her prescriptions picked up, some food purchased and a specific Entenmann's cake (?) obtained. It was a Sunday. It had been a long day already and I was tired. The weather was irritating. The Sunday paper was waiting. I had things to DO! But, I knew what I should do. So, I put on my responsible girl shoes and got in my car.

Since I have visual issues I require help in low light settings and always in the dark. I don't drive during cer-

tain hours (the dark ones, particularly, but sometimes the glary ones too). I need help down steps, on uneven ground and sometimes to find the toothpaste. People who need a lot of help do not always feel as if they need to be helpful to others. After all, they have their own issues. And just worrying about me can be a full time job.



After navigating the dark, inside parking lot at the Safeway (it was the middle of the afternoon) I was really




Hello.

Our God is like that.


It is a lesson to be careful what we ask for. But also a lesson to be careful not to miss the opportunities to venture ever closer to God to become who God in-
