

Article VII, Section 5

5. The Parish Council shall represent the Parish and be responsible for the transaction of Parish business between Parish meetings. The Parish Council shall be responsible for the operation and management of the real and personal property of the Parish. In the accomplishment of these responsibilities, the Parish Council shall be authorized to spend sums up to \$10,000 per transaction for necessary improvements, repairs, and ordinary items of business. Expenditures in excess of this authorization must receive the approval of the Parish at a duly convened Parish meeting; provided, however, if the expenditure is within a line item included within the annual budget approved by the Parish, then the Council may make such expenditure even if it exceeds the \$10,000 limit.

Article X, Section 2

2. The Parish property shall be acquired, administered, and disposed of for the general benefit of the Parish and its subordinate organizations. Contributions may be made for social, welfare, charitable, and other community causes as authorized by Parish meetings or the Parish Council.

Article X, Section 4

4. All actions taken at a meeting of the members of the Parish for the purchase or disposal of Parish property valued in excess of \$10,000, shall require an affirmative vote by two-thirds (2/3) of those present and voting. The Parish Council will have the discretion to dispose of or acquire property valued at \$10,000 or less; provided, however, if the purchase is within a line item included within the annual budget approved by the Parish, then the Council may make such purchase even if it exceeds the \$10,000 limit.
