ANGEL TREE AND HOLIDAY COLLECTIONS. We will be begin collecting donations for holiday grocery cards this Sunday (11/10), and we plan to have the basket available for additional upcoming Sundays as well. St. Mark has an account with Giant Food to facilitate the purchase of grocery cards at a 5% discount, so the best way to donate is via check or cash. If you donate via check, please indicate "outreach" in the memo line: this will give us the flexibility to use funds in excess of our needs for this campaign for other outreach opportunities. The outreach budget line, for example, is also used to support Father's ongoing needs for grocery cards: people in need in our community approach him throughout the year for assistance. Our objectives this year for Highland Elementary School families are 25 (twenty-five) \$50 (fifty dollar) grocery cards for both Thanksgiving and Christmas.

The angel tree cutouts with the wish lists of 40 children will be delivered to St. Mark on Friday, 15 November. We will have the customary, little tree set up at church beginning Sunday, 24 November: this will give our parishioners the opportunity to select their angels in time to take advantage of the discounts traditionally made available around Thanksgiving time.

Please take a cutout from the tree or table, and then print your name against the cutout's number (see the back of each cutout) on the sign-up sheet. This will allow us to track the progress of the campaign and ensure that we end up covering all 40 children. Please hang on to your gifts until the Sundays designated for collection: 1 December and 8 December will be the primary collection dates; 15 December will be the final, make-up collection date. We will have the usual collection box available for you to place your donated items. Please ensure that the tracking number associated with your cutout is prominently displayed on each item – either written with a permanent marker or taped on securely. The tracking numbers are the only means we will have to ensure that the gifts gets to the intended children.

Guidance/Recommendations:

1. We would like each child to receive at least \$25 (twenty-five dollars) in value – either in the form of one or more gifts or a gift card (Target and Wal Mart preferred). If you end up going the gift card route, please include the receipt and evidence of card activation. If you decide on one or more cards, please hand them directly to me or Nina in an envelope labelled with the designated child's cutout number.

- 2. One gift per child with a value of \$25 will be perfectly adequate. If you choose to go beyond that and select more than one item from the child's wish list on the back of the cutout, I have been assured by the coordinator that your desires will be honored: the donated items will be given to the designated child.
- 3. There is no need to gift-wrap the items.
- 4. When you select one of the cutouts, PLEASE ensure that you print your name legibly on the signup sheet against that particular cutout's number. The numbers are indicated on the back of the cutouts.
- 5. If you decide on a gift card but don't have time to purchase one, I will be happy to do it for you: simply hand me an envelope containing either cash or a check (made out to St. Mark Orthodox Church with the memo/purpose line indicating "Angel Tree"). Please indicate, on the front of the envelope, your name and the cutout number associated with the designated child.

2020 - FOCA GIFTS OF LOVE APPEAL The Fellowship of Orthodox Christians in America (F.O.C.A.), a nationwide organization of Orthodox Christians, has designated two charities (St Herman House in Cleveland and the Diocese of Alaska - for support of the pilgrimage to honor the 50th anniversary of the canonization of St. Herman) for its annual Gifts of Love Appeal.

St Herman House – FOCUS Cleveland is an Orthodox Christian house of hospitality. It serves the homeless and poor of the Ohio City neighborhood of Cleveland and the surrounding area. It has been in operation since September 1977. The mission of St. Herman House is to support homeless men on the path to well-being and independence in a safe and stable environment, and to meet the basic needs of the people in the community. It has an emergency shelter for 28 men and a transitional home that accommodates 12 men. In addition, it is the only facility in northeast Ohio that serves three meals a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year to anyone in need.

In 2018, 75,997 meals were served, which is an average of 208 people fed every day.

St Herman House has a current need for approximately \$5,000 towards the replacement of a vertical platform lift in the front of the building. The lift is used by disabled persons and has been broken for 8 months. It cannot be fixed, and the cost to install a new one is \$19,000. They have applied for a grant for \$14,000 (and have been unofficially told that they are being awarded the money), which leaves them \$5,000 short. There is currently no way for wheelchair-bound people, or those unable to walk up the stairs, to enter. As one of the recipients of the 2020 Gifts of Love, the first \$5000 raised will be provided to pay for the remainder of the cost of the lift.

The remainder of the monies raised will be sent to the Diocese of Alaska to assist with needs associated with the influx of pilgrims scheduled to attend the 50th Anniversary of the canonization of St. Herman in Kodiak. Until recently, commercial fishermen helped to ferry pilgrims from Kodiak onto Spruce Island. Due to the potential insurance liability, they have since limited their assistance. Fr. Innocent Dresdow is currently purchasing and repairing fishing boats to assist the pilgrims. In addition, the parishes in the area provide meals to those attending the pilgrimage and do not charge for this hospitality. Our generous dona-
