The Whole Truth

Christ gave us two commandments: to love God and to love our fellow man. Everything else, even the commandments contained in the Beatitudes, is merely an elaboration of these two commandments, which

contain within themselves the totality of Christ's "Good News." Furthermore, Christ's earthly life is nothing other than the revelation of the mystery of the love of God and the love of man. These are, in sum, not only the true but the only measure of all things ... Their conjunction is not simply a conjunction of two great truths taken from two spiritual worlds. It is the conjunction of two parts of a single whole. These two commandments are two aspects of a single truth. Destroy either one of them and you destroy truth as a whole. (St Maria of Paris)

For to Such belongs the Kingdom of Heaven

With all the recent preparations and efforts made to restart our parish in person church school program, children have been more in the forefront of my mind lately and it brings me great joy to hear their voices in church! The words of Christ in the title above come from Mt. 19:14 in which our Lord says: "Let the children come to me, they may not always seem "attentive" to outright instruction, they need to be surrounded by and immersed in the practice of Christian love, respect and virtue. Prayer, familiarity with the lives of the saints, the reading of scripture and the expectation of mutual respect among family members, will reveal Christ to them - not only in mind,

and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of Heaven." In context, Jesus was addressing His own disciples who "rebuked" the people for bringing the children. The disciples likely

thought they were doing the right thing by trying to manage a chaotic situation and give the Rabbi some space and peace. But Jesus was absolutely clear in commanding them not hinder them.

This should speak to us on many levels. To be sure, we should be doing everything we can in order to encourage children to come to know Christ. Beginning, as Proverbs 22:6 urges, by training them up "in the way they should go". And although church attendance and participation in Sunday School will help this, the vast majority of their spiritual formation happens in the home within the family. Although



but more importantly, in heart.

We who are entrusted with the care of children must look after them physically, keep them healthy and protect them, but also be for them living

examples of child-like qualities such as openess, innocence, trust, humility and obedience. As our Lord said in Mt. 18:3: "unless ... you become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven."

So as we attempt to navigate the many responsibilites we have and life choices that must be made, let us always beseech God for guidance particularly in regard to how it will impact children. There are indeed many hindrances in our world today that seek to block their path to the Lord. But we must try to overcome them.

In this prayer before the Ambo, read at each liturgy by the most recently ordained serving priest (the "baby priest"), we wrap things up and get ready to return to the world, to the "liturgy after the liturgy" as Mother Maria Skobtsova referred to our lives. But we are reminded in this prayer, and in the psalms and Akathists also, about the "beauty of Thy house." And God's house, the one where we pray the Divine Liturgy, is very beautiful. Over my two decades at St. Mark I have seen the beauty of God's house at 7124 River Road enhanced and beautified, decorated and adorned.

There are those who come in the quiet of the day and vacuum, or iron candlewax off of the carpet. Those who dust the icon lattice and polish the wooden pews. The trash removers, the candle organizers, the glass changers, and the light adjusters. They and many others love the beauty of God's house. And if they don't, they act as if they do, allowing a place for that love to grow in their hearts.

Why take such care for a place we spend so little time? Why bring fresh flowers when we won't be back for a week or so? Fresh flowers wilt and decompose and, as we found, some can attract fruit flies. And yet there is nothing like that fragrance when we bend over the



cross that has been decorated with roses or lilies or hibiscus. For that moment, caught up in the sight and scent of the beauty that God provides we grow closer to God, the author of all beauty, in Whom beauty resides and by Whom it is shared with us.

We enhance that place because it is a sacred space and that sacredness is there whether we are present or not. And in that hour we spend there we are caught up with God. If we allow it, and invite it, we can become partakers of the Divine nature, eating and drinking Him. We bring all that we have: our brokenness, our problems, our weaknesses and strengths, our gifts and actions to the place of glory, to the foot of the cross, to the altar of God.

The flower people, led by Shirley Dean, cut, position, adjust and tweak; they set up and take away. They store, and clip and fluff flowers and arrangements. With just a few pieces, or decked out for a great feast, flowers enhance the beauty of God's house. Thank you to all who arrange those flowers and who carry the heavy vases up and down from the walk-in.

And thank you also to Tom Jenkins, whose skill with hammer and saw enhances the beauty of God's house. Tom's woodwork

FOCA CH. 229 - 25th ANNIVERSARY




