Rector's Report

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Christ is Risen!

I greet you all with joy during this glorious and bright Paschal season! We have much to give thanks to the Lord for already in 2025. The council members that you elected last November were confirmed and installed in January and have been meeting regularly to decide on and conduct the activities of our parish life. Great Lent went very well this year with regular and prayerful liturgical services and a varied array of interesting Lenten Lectures. Thank you to all our speakers! Our choir put forth an outstanding effort – thank you! And thanks to our tech volunteers as well for live streaming the services which were viewed and enjoyed by many. Also, thanks to our faithful altar servers, candle tenders and glass changers. The addition of the reading of the life of St. Mary of Egypt on Thursday of the fifth week of lent helped us understand the tremendous miracle of repentance.

Just before we entered into the intensity of Holy Week and our Lord's Passion, it was our joy to celebrate the Feast of Palms (The raising of Lazarus and the Entry of our Lord into Jerusalem). This year we were joined by His Beatitude Metropolitan Tikhon on Palm Sunday who presided during the Holy Liturgy, tonsured Victor Lutes to the office of "Reader", and ordained Mihail Mihailov to the office of sub deacon as well as to the Holy Diaconate.
