ONLINE CLASS – SVS: HEARING THE CHURCH’S HYMNS

Join us in the parish hall for a live group viewing!

In this four-week online course, Dn. Harrison Russin opens the hymnography and music of the Triodion as a single art. Through four case studies: the Great Canon, the daily idiomela, the Akathist, and the hymns of Holy Week, you’ll learn how these hymns embed scriptural interpretation and how their music carries theological meaning. Whether you sing in a choir or simply pray these services, you’ll come away listening with new attention.

Week 1: St. Andrew of Crete and the Great Canon

How does a single hymn become a school of repentance? We explore St. Andrew of Crete’s Great Canon the way it weaves scriptural interpretation into its verses, and the bond it forges between text, meter, and music.

Since we understand Communion to mean that we have all things in common, sharing an identical Faith, only those who are members of the Orthodox Church and who have prepared themselves through prayer, fasting and recent confession may participate in Holy Communion. Following reception of Holy Communion, we should stay in the church until the conclusion of the Liturgy. Our fellowship begins after we venerate the Cross and receive the Blessed Bread (of which all may partake). If you have questions concerning the above, please feel free to speak with Fr. Gregory after Liturgy.

ON COMMUNION: The fasting rules concerning communion apply to those who are healthy enough to keep them. If for example, you require medication that cannot be taken on an empty stomach, please speak to me about the possible need to eat or drink something along with it in the morning prior to liturgy. CHILDREN’S BOOKS Two baskets of children’s books are now located in the vestibule, behind where the greeters stand and next to the stairway to the choir loft. Children should feel free to borrow the books and can return them to the baskets.

TO OUR VISITORS WITH YOUNG CHILDREN: If you are seeking a quiet place to nurse or calm a rambunctious child, there are two rooms off of the main hallway on this floor to serve you. Our library is the second door on the left as well as our teen classroom, the last door on the left, at the end of the hallway. The library has rocking chairs, and both rooms offer comfortable couches and moderate privacy. Changing tables are located in the Ladies room on the upper level and in the Men’s room on the lower level.

HVAC FUNDRAISING Perhaps you’ve seen the fundraising posters around our church building. As per our most recent parish meeting, we are about to embark on the replacement of the entire HVAC system at a total cost of approximately \$700,000. Funds have been set aside for this purpose for several years.

Presently, just over \$300,000 in reserves is available to dedicate to this project, some of which is the result of recent fundraisers and special gifts. We are applying for a second trust loan in the maximum amount of \$500,000, in case costs go over budget, which often happens with large projects such as this. The terms of the loan are not yet known, but the interest rate is likely to be more than 7% per annum. Our current loan is at 4.5% per annum, has a balance of \$486,218, and our monthly payment is \$3,523. Borrowing close to \$400,000 could double our monthly payments, due to the higher interest rate.

We realize that many may not be in a position to make a large donation. Our Lord regarded the donation of two mites from the poor widow as greater than all other gifts (Mark 12:42) because she gave all that she had, but some among us are blessed with a greater abundance of resources. This is a time to prayerfully consider a gift to reduce the strain on our parish finances.

HVAC FUNDRAISING - DONATING STOCK The stock market is now at an all-time high. You may own stocks that have increased significantly in value. For those in a position to do so, a very tax efficient way to donate to the HVAC project is to transfer appreciated stock into St. Mark’s Schwab account. Several parish members have used this method recently.

For example, a person may be willing to make a gift of \$10,000. Rather than giving cash, that person could transfer stock purchased for \$4,000 that is now worth \$10,000. The generous donor would receive a tax deduction of \$10,000, and will not recognize capital gains tax on the \$6,000 increase. The donor can then purchase the same shares for the \$10,000 in cash the donor was otherwise willing to donate. This eliminates \$6,000 of capital gains tax, provides a donation to St. Mark of \$10,000, and increases the tax basis in the shares to \$10,000, reducing taxes on a future sale.

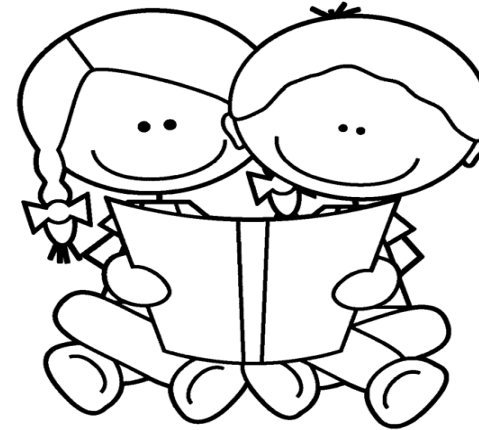

Modern saints: St. Porphyrios

Slavic saints: Sts. Cyril & Methodius, St. Sava, St. Nikolai Velimirovich

Biblical saints: The Holy Myrrh bearers

Early Church saints: St. Thekla, St. Paraskevi

Family saints: St. Emmelia (mother of St. Basil the Great, St. Gregory of Nyssa, St. Macrina, and several other saints)

Special Agents of Christ: A Prayer Book for Young Orthodox Saints by Annalisa Boyd A prayer book written especially for Orthodox youth. Uses the engaging "special agent" theme to encourage young people to see themselves as disciples of Christ.

The Prayer Rope A beautifully illustrated introduction to the Jesus Prayer and the Orthodox prayer rope.

The Three-Day Pascha by Mother Melania A children's book explaining Christ's Passion, death, burial, and Resurrection. Mother Melania's books are generally known for presenting Orthodox theology in a gentle, poetic way.

A Child's Guide to the Divine Liturgy One of the best introductory books for helping children understand what is happening during the Liturgy.

A Child's Guide to Confession Helps children prepare for the Mystery of Confession in an age-appropriate way. Focuses on God's mercy rather than fear, making it a helpful resource for families
